

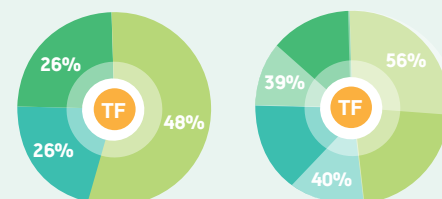
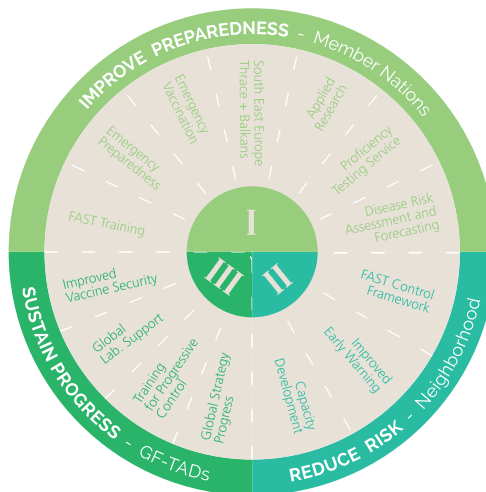
Phase V. Biennium 2019-2021. Hold-FAST strategy. Foot-and-mouth and similar transboundary animal diseases

Overall goal of the action

A lower foot-and-mouth (FMD) risk enabling better trade conditions and higher food security prospects for European stakeholders in the livestock sector.

Result achieved!

There were no FMD cases in EU Member Nations
Reduced expenditure from veterinary emergency funds on FMD in period 2019-2021 compared to previous 17 year average.

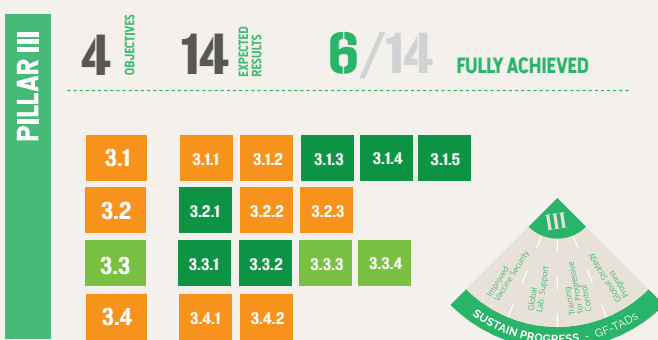
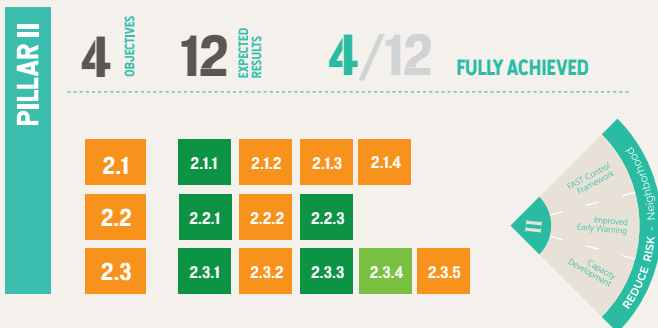
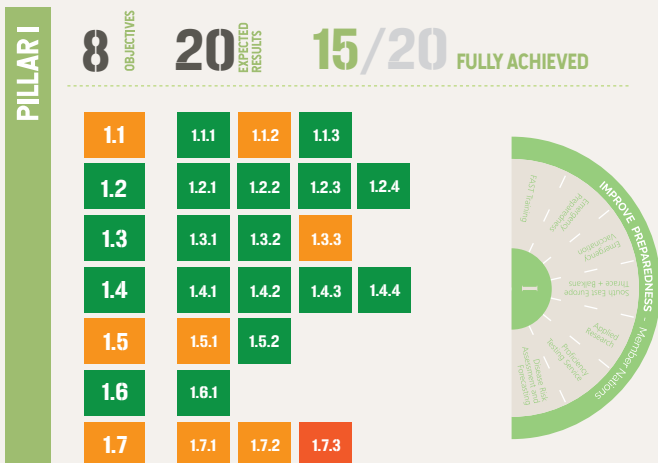
BETTER CONTROL
