ONLINE FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE INVESTIGATION Training Course

This course is for veterinarians who are involved in diagnosing, investigating and controlling outbreaks of foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) in countries that are not free of the disease.

What will the participants learn?

The course includes interactive, applied training on:

- Aetiology and pathogenesis;
- Clinical diagnosis;
- Lesion ageing;
- Outbreak investigation;
- biosecurity;
- vaccines and vaccination;
- Progressive Control Pathway.

In addition, the course provides access to a range of tools that can be used to cascade knowledge to colleagues working to support animal health and livestock keepers.

- > The course involves twelve hours of study over a four-week period. You will study alongside a community of veterinarians working to overcome similar challenges.
- > The course includes two live interactive webinars which provide the opportunity to discuss the challenges of FMD control with international experts. Our expert trainers are then available throughout the course in an online discussion forum to answer questions from the trainees, and to lead interactive discussions.
- > Seven interactive online modules that include animations, videos and self-test questions can be studied at a time and pace to suit you.
- > At the end of the course, all trainees must complete a comprehensive assessment. Successful trainees are provided with a certificate, and where appropriate, records of completion are passed to the sponsoring body.
- > The course has so far been organized in five languages (English, Russian, French, Arabic and Turkish) and can be arranged as a national course, adapting the materials to include information specific to the host country's FMD control strategies and including experts from the host country as trainers.
